Dear Mr Rasmussen,

I am writing to you as a friend of Cleve Foster who faces execution on Tuesday. I have written to Cleve for four years and do not believe he has had justice nor do I believe he deserves to be part of the macabre experiment that will be played out tomorrow.

Why is the Danish government so silent on this? Is it not imperative on any government to voice terrible concerns even if those concerns fall on deaf ears? Is it not ironic that a country that was named happiest and least corrupt is failing to make every defence it can of fellow human beings who are in desperate need of champions wherever they might be?

Denmark has a global reputation for justice and equity. During the Second World War many Danish citizens risked their lives to oppose a regime where human experimentation was practised and condoned. Surely it is your moral duty to everything in your power to prevent Texas from enacting its own paltry, barbaric final solution, ridding itself of people with less consideration than might be given animals sent for slaughter?

As the great Edmund Burke once said: 'It is necessary only for the good man to do nothing for evil to triumph'.

It may be too late to save Cleve but it is not too late to condemn outright the manner of his death and strive to prevent others.
